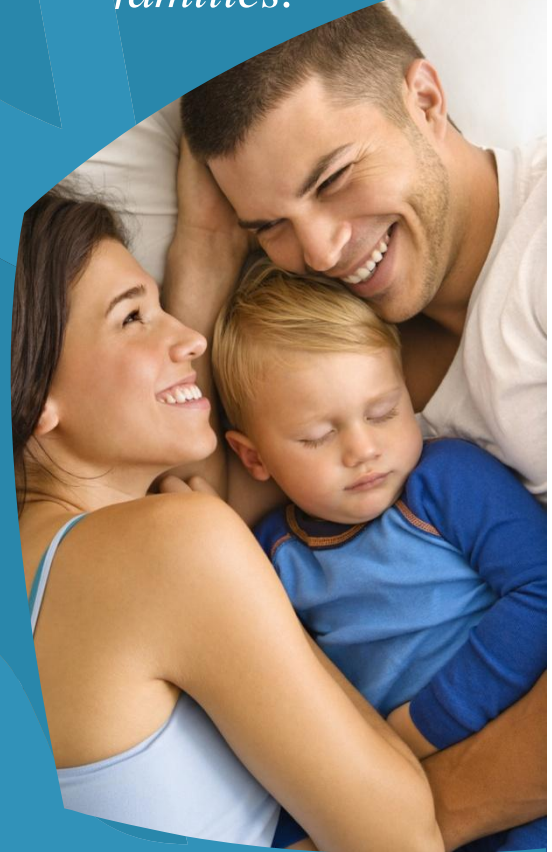

NSCYCWA Code of Ethics

The Nova Scotia Child and Youth Care Workers Association is Governed by a code of ethics, which act as guiding principles. Ethics assist members in choosing appropriate behaviour in the role of therapeutic interveners with children, youth and families.

- Voting privileges (Student Members may vote and hold office in regional committees, and then may have the option to upgrade)

Membership Options

Full \$50

Available for those meeting the standard for youth care practice. Entitled to all privileges of membership. Membership is good for one year, beginning from the month of payment.

Student \$25

Available to those pursuing full-time studies pertaining to theory of child and youth care practice. Entitled to all privileges of membership. Membership is good for one year, beginning from the month of payment. If a student is interested in holding executive office upon graduation, they are able to upgrade their membership to Full, with a payment of \$25 before the expiry of their student membership. This membership will expire one year after upgrade.

Associate Membership \$35

Available to those who are not directly connected to the field of Child and Youth Care Workers, yet believe in and would like to support Nova Scotia Child and Youth Care Workers.

Agency \$150

Available to agencies that support the goals, purposes and objectives of the NSCYCWA. Entitled to one vote and one membership rate at NSCYCWA functions. Membership is good for one year, beginning from the month of payment.

Honorary

Bestowed on those who have made extraordinary contributions to the Association pending the discretion of the Executive Board. This membership does not expire.
